Since the inter pregnancy period is a continuum for overall health and wellness, all women of reproductive age who have been pregnant, regardless of the outcome of their pregnancies (i.e., miscarriage, abortion, preterm, full-term delivery), should receive IPC as a continuum from postpartum care (Table 45.1). However, it should be acknowledged that not all women will want to or will have subsequent pregnancies or children.

Inter pregnancy interval is the period between the end of a previous pregnancy and the beginning of the next pregnancy. It can only be defined retrospectively. An IPI is said to be short when it is less than 24 months and long when it is more than 5 years. Both extremes of IPIs have been linked to an increased risk of poorer outcomes in infants and their mothers. Following a miscarriage or an induced abortion, the recommended minimum interval to next pregnancy is at least six months in order to reduce risks of adverse maternal and perinatal outcomes. However, the age of the woman and other comorbidities should also be considered when making recommendations regarding IPI.

The IPI is a modifiable risk factor because, with the provision of appropriate and effective contraception, women can control when their next pregnancy occurs.

- To minimize maternal and infant mortality by reducing the causes for complications during pregnancy and delivery (to end preventable maternal and child deaths due to conditions which may arise before or during pregnancy).
- To improve male involvement in maternal care.


